My dear Mr. Carrion:

Reference is made to your letter of February 15, 1956, addressed to Consul Leslie A. Weisenburg, concerning the immigrant visa case of Miss Antoinette Venzac, in whom your friend Mrs. Marie Louise Velasquez is interested.

The documents submitted by Mrs. Velasquez have been received and are satisfactory and sufficient.

Miss Venzac is registered for immigration on the French nonpreference waiting list, with a priority of October 12, 1955. Because of the heavily oversubscribed condition of the French quota a further waiting period of probably eight months will elapse before her turn is reached on the waiting list and a quota number becomes available for her use. Preliminary consideration will take place several months before that time and Miss Venzac will then be notified of the additional requirements for the completion of action in her case.

I have noted your interest in Miss Venzac's case and wish to assure you that she will be given every consideration consistent with the immigration laws and regulations.
