### Inaugural Ball

Attendance at the Ball is by invitation only. Price per ticket is \$25.00. Box seats are \$40.00 each or \$320.00 per box of 8. Individual box seats may be purchased. This is a formal dress affair.

### Housing

For housing, apply to Chairman, Mr. Charles Edward Rhett, Inaugural Committee, Liberty Loan Building, 14th and D Streets, S.W., Washington, D. C. All hotels in the area are requiring a minimum of four days reservations (January 17, 18, 19, 20). The Housing Committee must have the names and addresses of each person who is to occupy a room (for example: reservation cannot be accepted for Joe Doe and party of 5 to occupy three double rooms). There are no suites available. There are no rooms overlooking Pennsylvania Avenue. As far as possible, groups will be kept together but there is no assurance that this can be strictly adhered to. The Housing Committee does not handle deposits. The Housing Committee assigns individuals to a specific hotel; the hotel, in turn, notifies the individual what accommodations are being made, the amount of deposit to be forwarded to the hotel and by what date. The Hotel Association emphasizes that there are accommodations for everyone.
