

Perea, McManus^{11/19/60} And Davis Did Not Vote In PR Election

Three Puerto Rican residents who played important roles in the past political campaign, did not vote in Tuesday's elections.

Dr. Salvador Perea, the Christian Action Party candidate for governor, did not vote, he said, because he did not register.

Most Rev. James P. Davis, archbishop of the San Juan Archdiocese, did not vote, according to an aide.
